Unique to the Caribbean

Safety Index Check-In

The Caribbean continues to be among the safest regions in the world, with a plethora of islands receiving Level 1 travel advisories (exercise normal precautions) from the U.S. State Department, including Anguilla; Antiqua and Barbuda; Aruba; Barbados; Bonaire; British Virgin Islands; Curacao; Dominica; Grenada; Montserrat; Saba; St. Kitts and Nevis; Saint Lucia; St. Vincent and the Grenadines; Sint Maarten and the Cayman Islands. Meanwhile, other popular destinations, such as the Bahamas, Cuba, Dominican Republic, and Turks and Caicos are listed at Level 2 (exercise increased caution) due to crime that rarely impacts tourists visiting resort areas.
